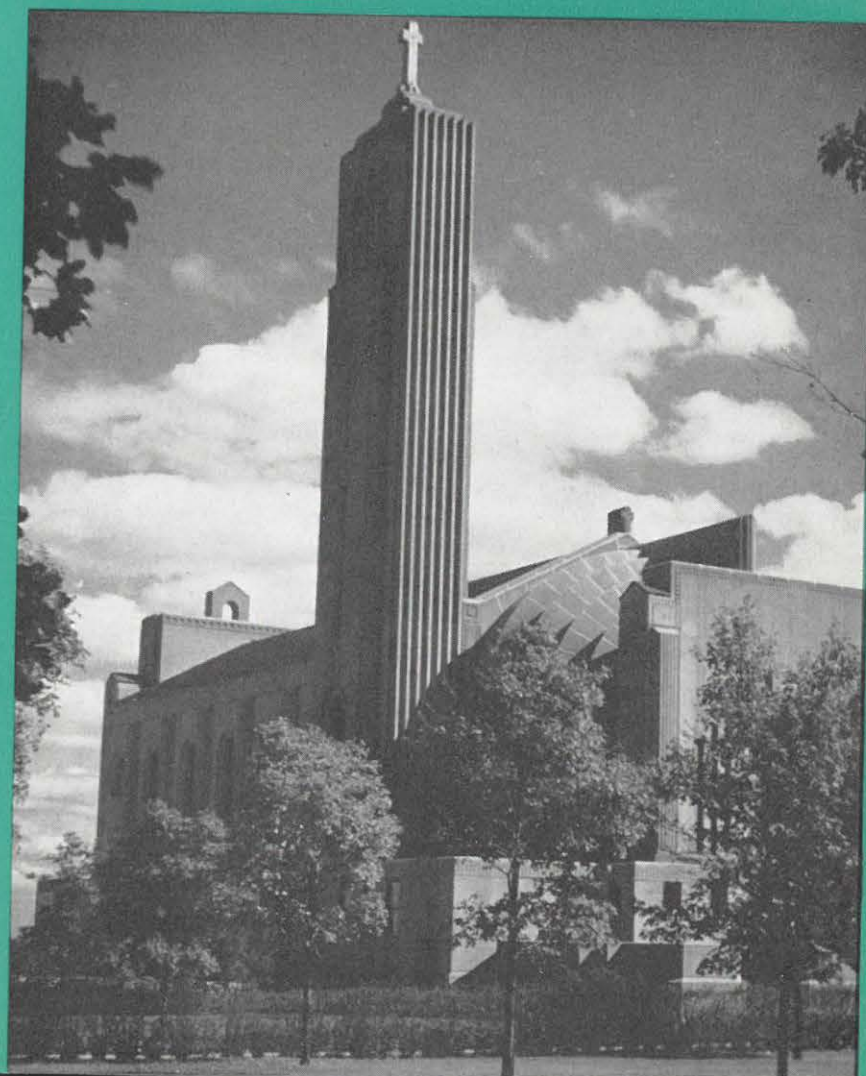
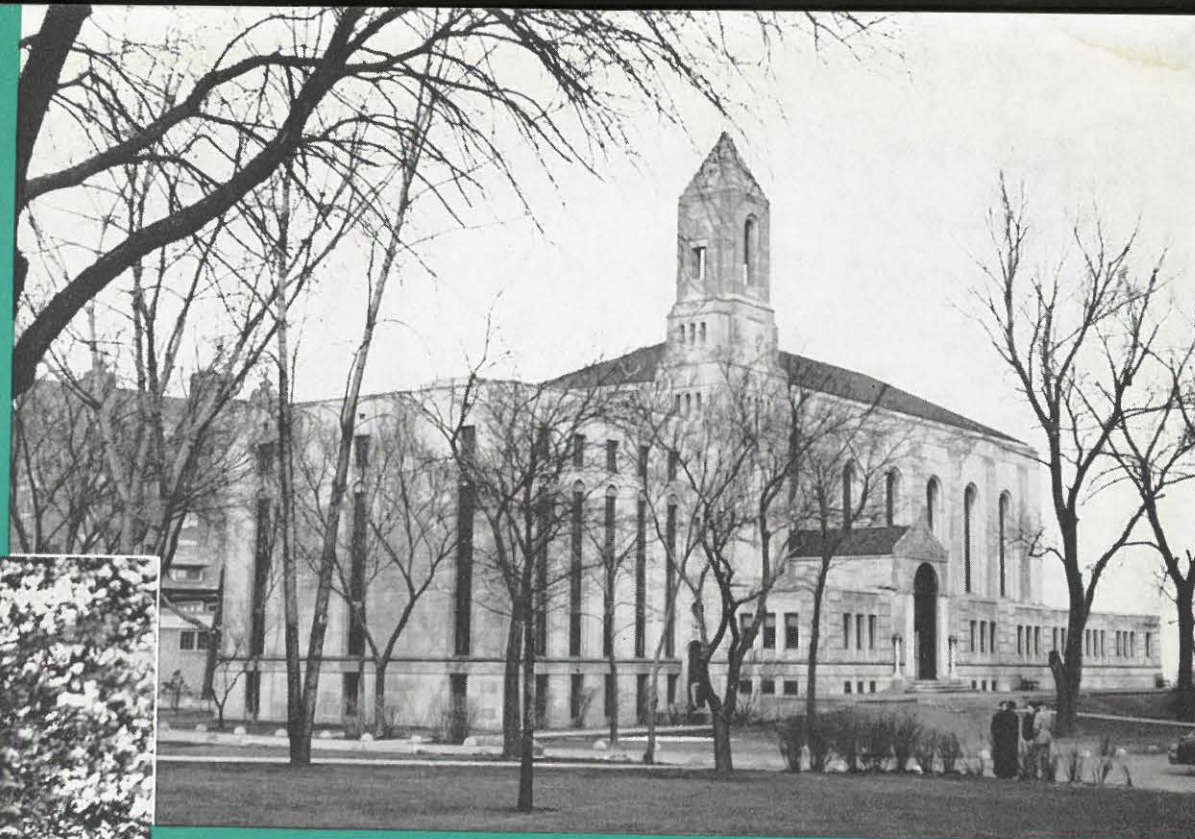
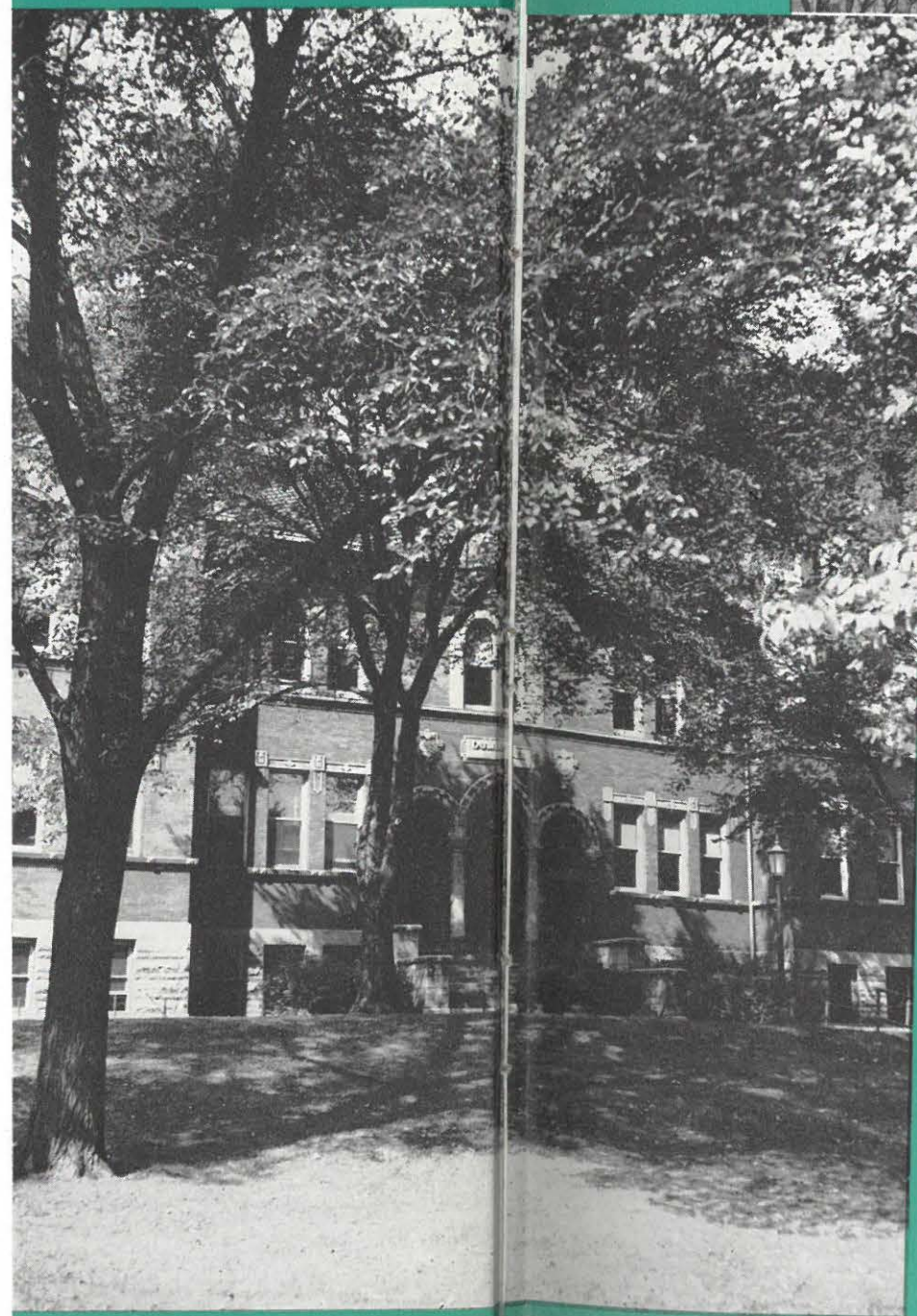
ON CAMPUS

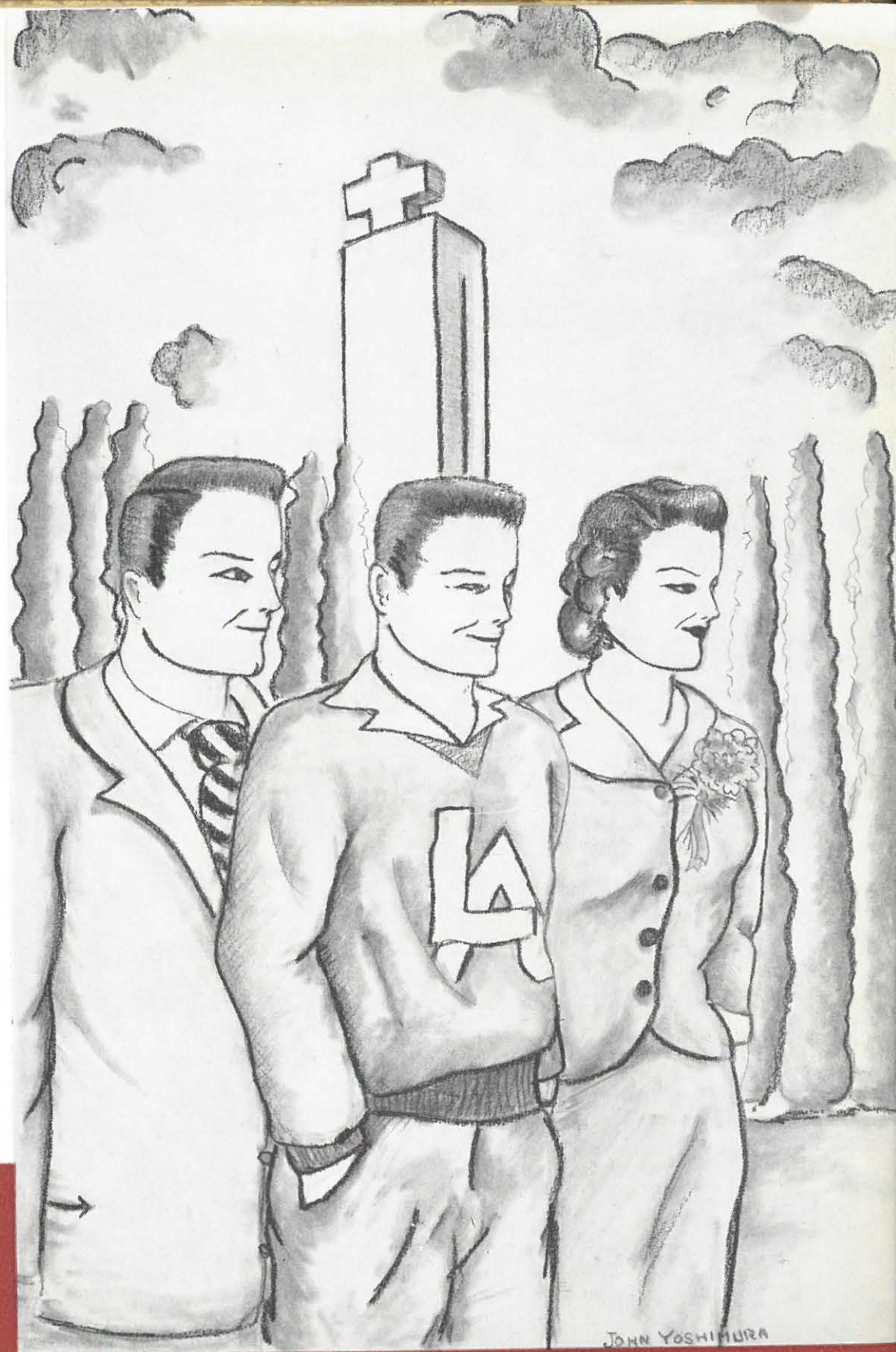
Loyola Academy is beautifully situated on the western shore of Lake Michigan about eight miles north of Chicago's Loop. It shares with the Lake Shore Division of Loyola University the buildings and facilities of the twenty-five acre campus.

The Cudahy Memorial Library, completed in 1930, affords the students free use of any books which they may need for class preparation or which they may wish to read for pleasure or information.

Most of the classrooms for Academy students are in Dumbach Hall. This structure, the oldest on campus, was erected in 1908. Classes for freshmen are conducted in the North Building, not pictured here.

In Madonna Della Strada Chapel, opened for use in 1939, students attend Mass and other devotional services, receive the Sacraments, hear spiritual talks by the priests of the faculty, and convene for the awarding of scholastic honors.

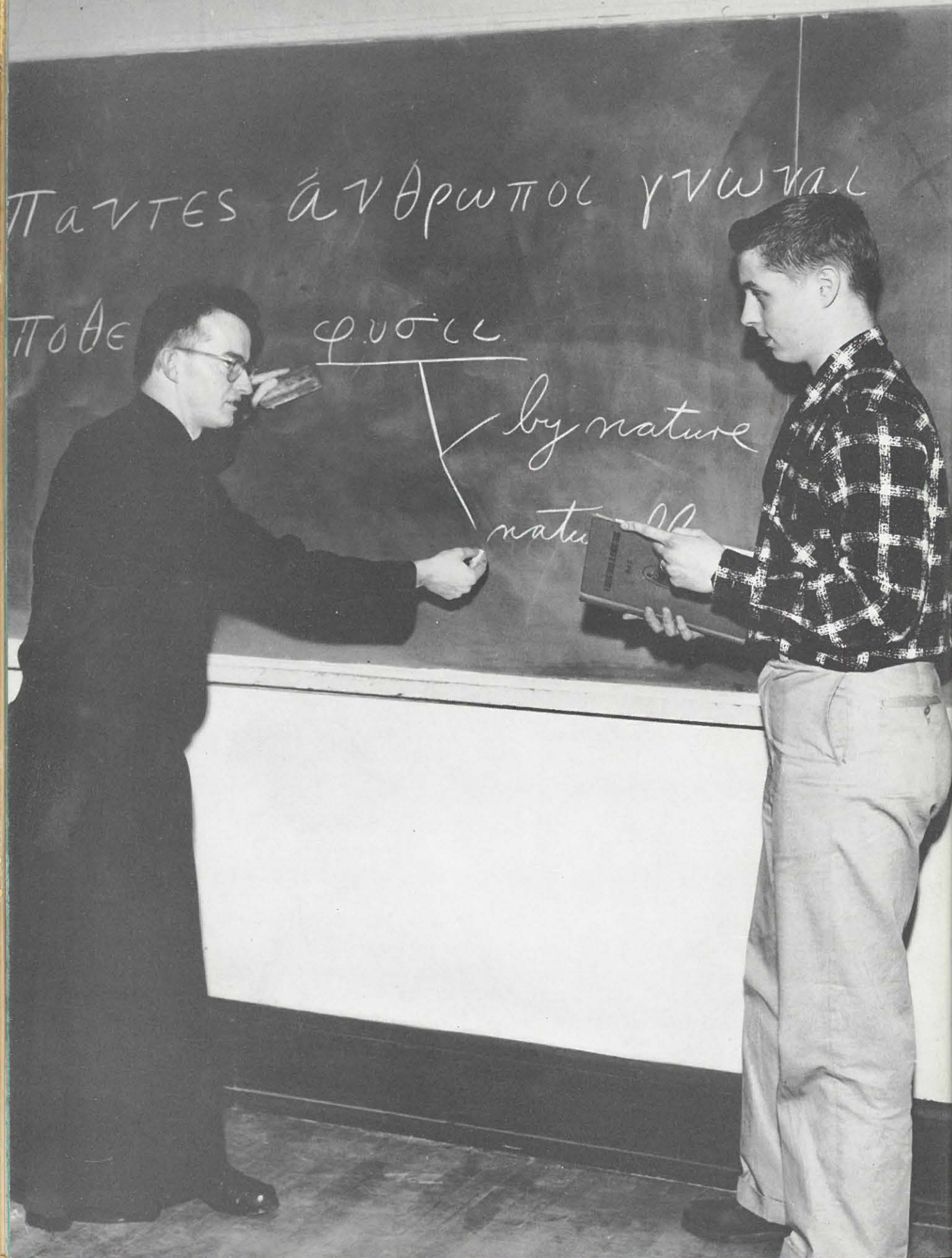
FOREWORD

Loyola Academy, because it was established to achieve definite cultural objectives, offers a special type of training on the high-school level. It is a Catholic school which gives the beginnings of a genuine humanistic training preparatory for Catholic higher education.

Jesuit secondary schools aim to prepare a solid Catholic substructure in the student's whole mind and character for any superstructure of learning, professional and special, as well as for the upbuilding of moral life, civil and religious. To fulfill that aim, Loyola has designed its four-year program.

During freshman and sophomore years all students receive instruction in religion, English, speech, Latin, algebra, plane geometry, and history.

Having completed second year, a student enrolls in that course which seems best suited to his intellectual maturity, his past achievement, and his inclination. The four curricula are identical in that all are strictly college preparatory; they differ in the degree of emphasis placed on humanistic values. Pages twelve through nineteen present in writing and pictures a detailed explanation of the four courses followed by juniors and seniors.



HONORS

The Honors Course, the most thoroughly humanistic of the four courses, is designed for very select students. It gives strong emphasis to the literature of ancient Greece and Rome, for from these two pre-Christian centers of civilization much of Western culture has radiated. Familiarization with great ideas, well conceived and richly expressed by men like Caesar, Cicero, Vergil, and Homer, when these ideas are further enhanced by the ideals of Christ, tends to foster in the student worthwhile ideas and noble ideals that he can offer to his generation.

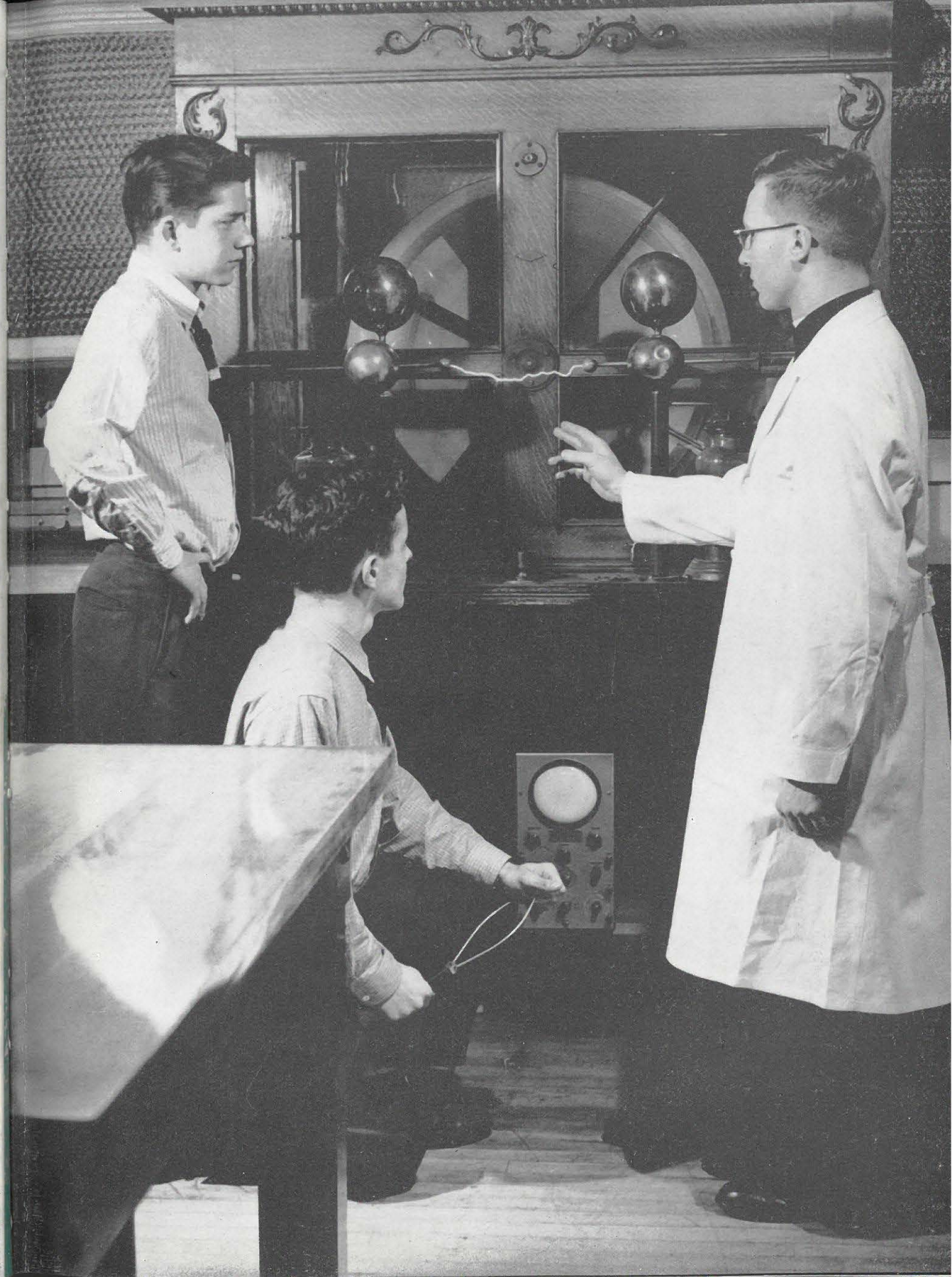
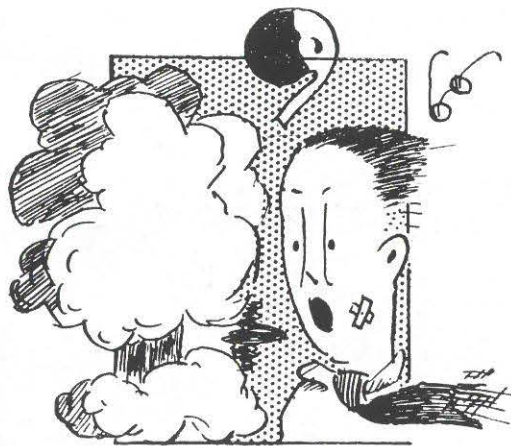


SCIENTIFIC

Today the Catholic Church needs scientists, men who having received a thoroughly Catholic training will be able to give to the truth and the falsity in modern science relative light and shade.

For those who have a considered preference and a notable aptitude for things scientific and who plan to attend a school which trains the scientists, the engineers, and the mathematicians of the future, this program provides the necessary prerequisites.

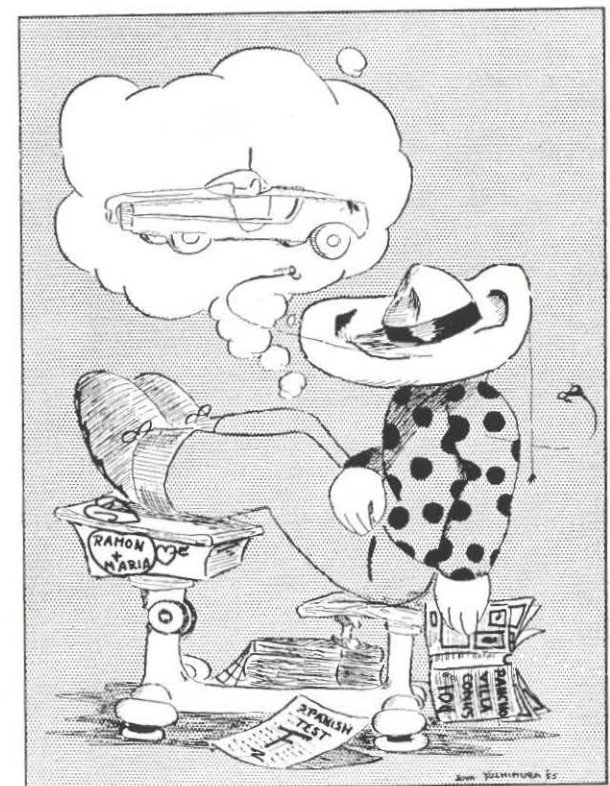
The Scientific Course substitutes for Greek an extra science and mathematics course. Apart from this it is similar to the Honors curriculum.





LATIN - ENGLISH

Latin, English, religion, and speech are regular subjects in the Honors, Scientific, and Latin-English courses. The last differs from the others chiefly in that students in the Latin-English course do not study Greek nor all of the mathematics and science but strive rather to master a modern language, either French or Spanish. French or Spanish is in this case a full-time major subject, whereas for Honors and Scientific students it is an optional minor. In third year the student chooses either mathematics or modern history, in fourth year either physics or chemistry.



ENGLISH

Social science studies characterize the English curriculum, economics in junior year and sociology in senior year. To English students is given the same option as that given to Honors and Latin-English students with regard to mathematics, modern history, physics, and chemistry.

This is the only one of the programs which does not require four years' training in Latin. But since language study produces a marked quickening of the reasoning powers and effects a certain delicacy of judgment and fineness of perception, the course includes daily instruction in either French or Spanish.

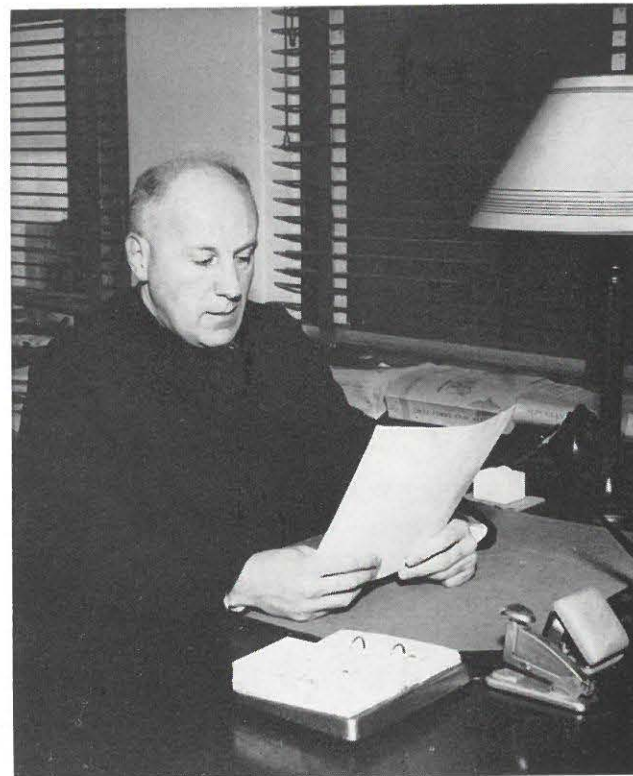

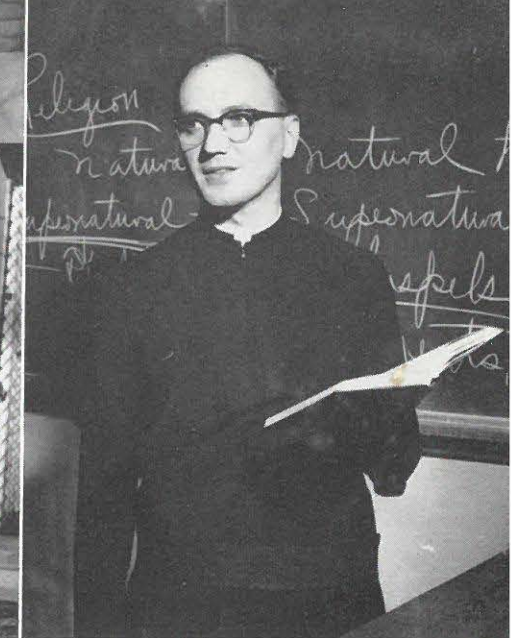
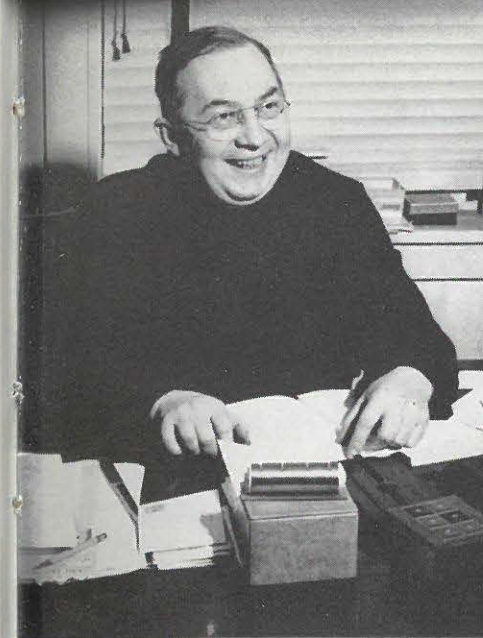


ADMINISTRATORS

School officially opens in September with the Mass of the Holy Ghost in Madonna Della Strada Chapel.

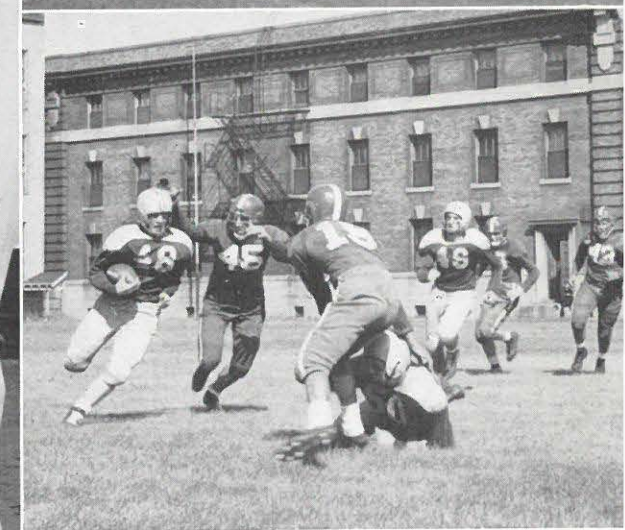
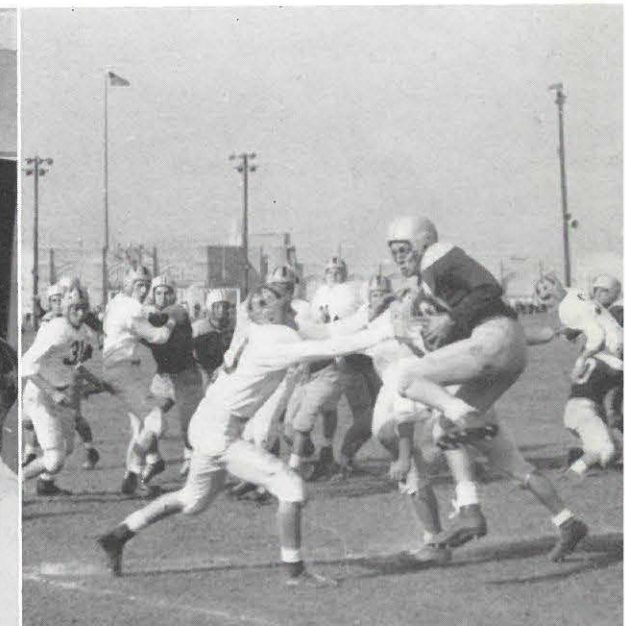

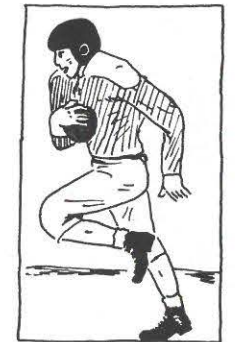

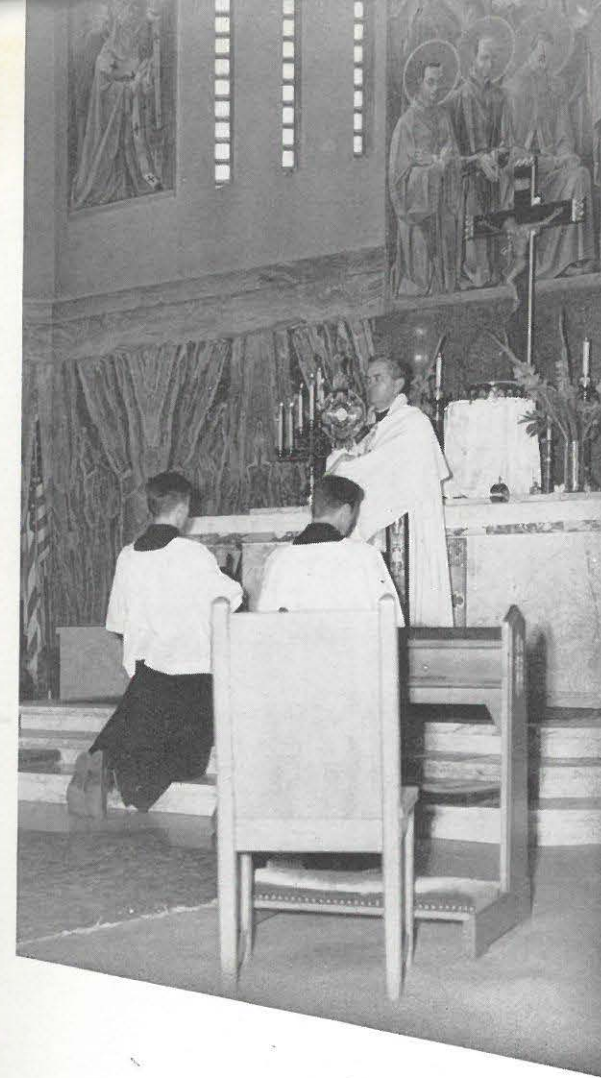

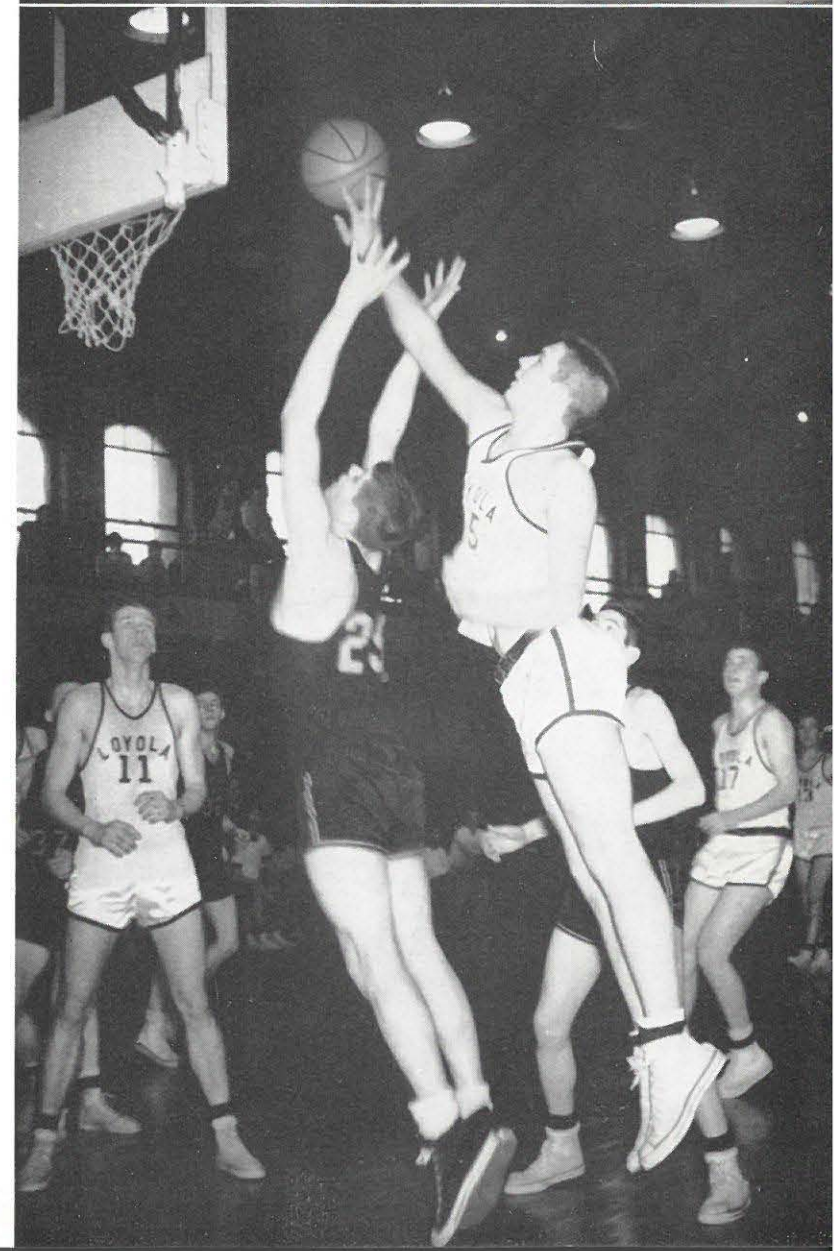

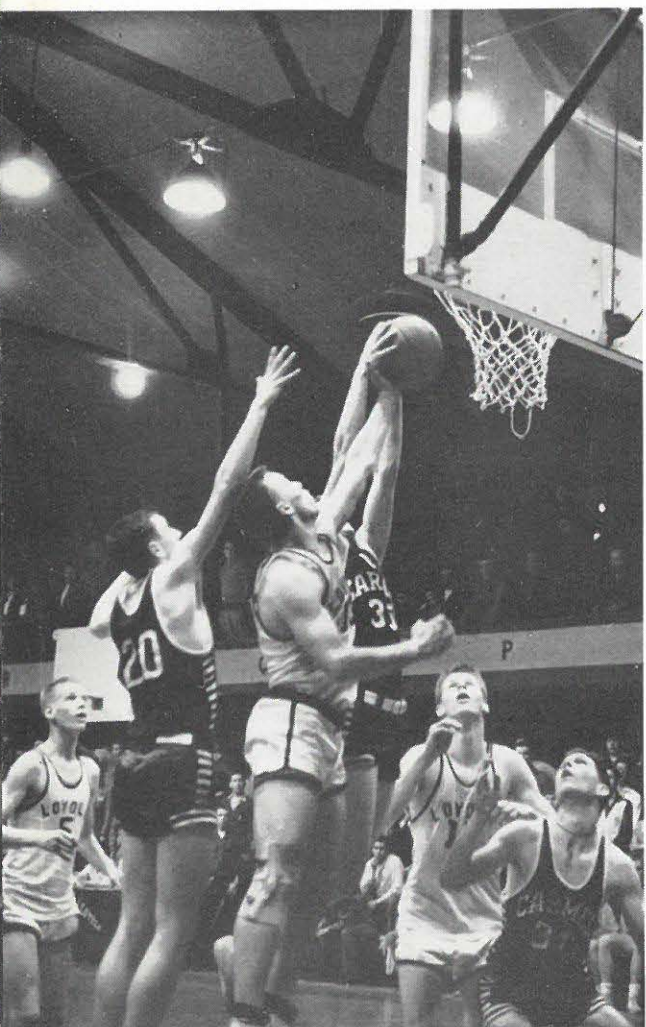

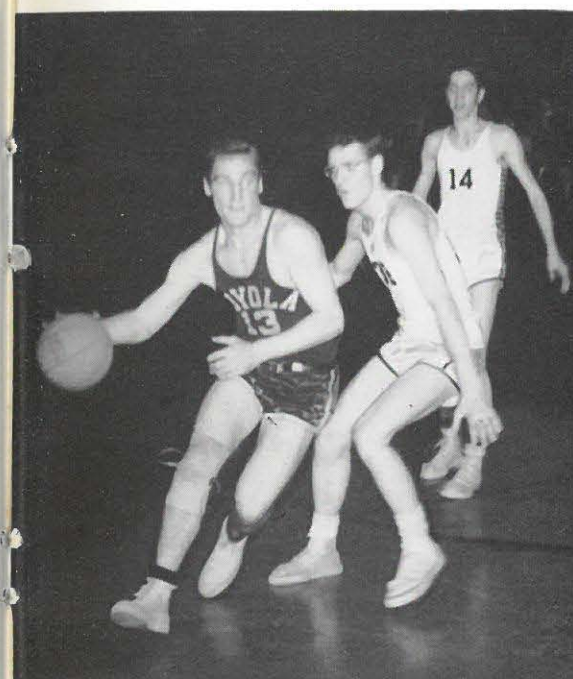

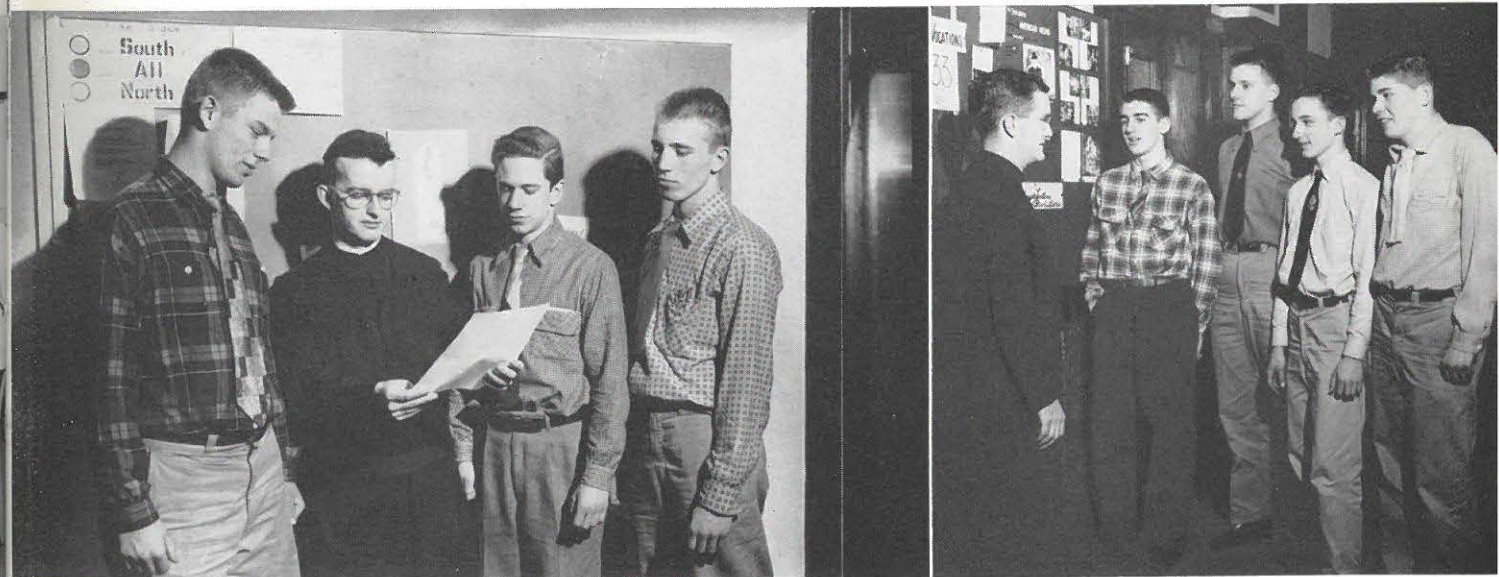

FRENCH CLUB

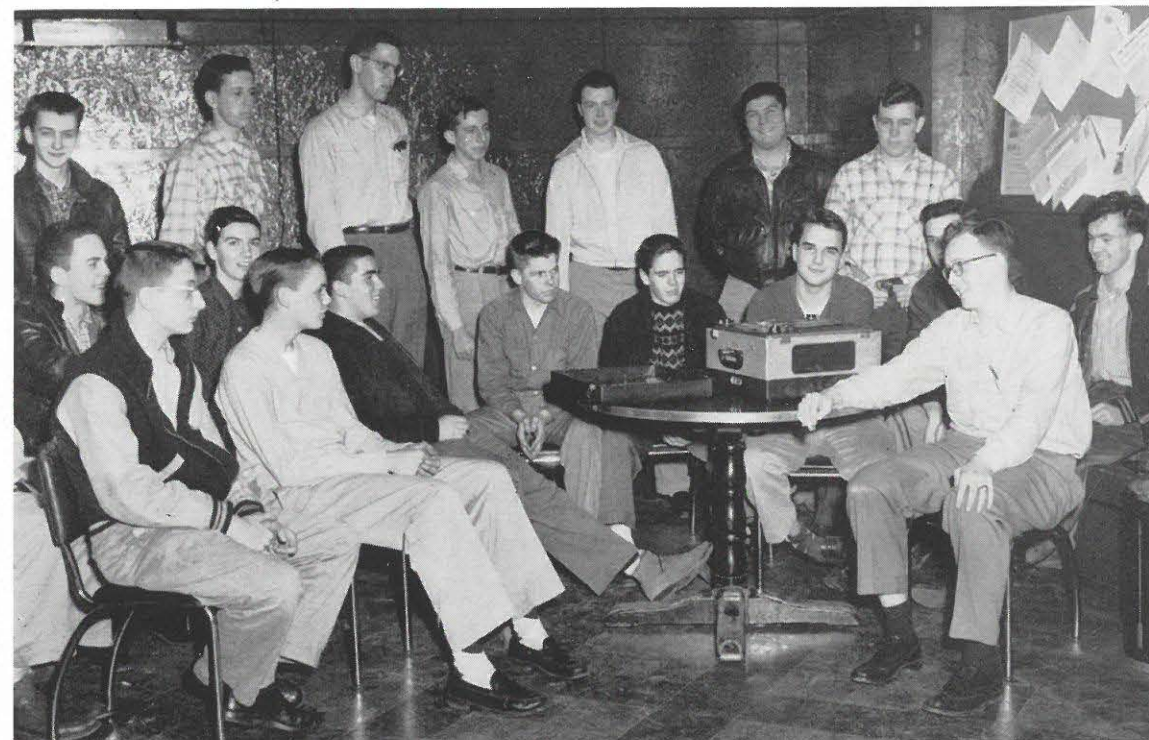
Lectures, discussions, and movies, all in French, these make up the order of events for the meetings of the French Club, *Le Circle Francais*.

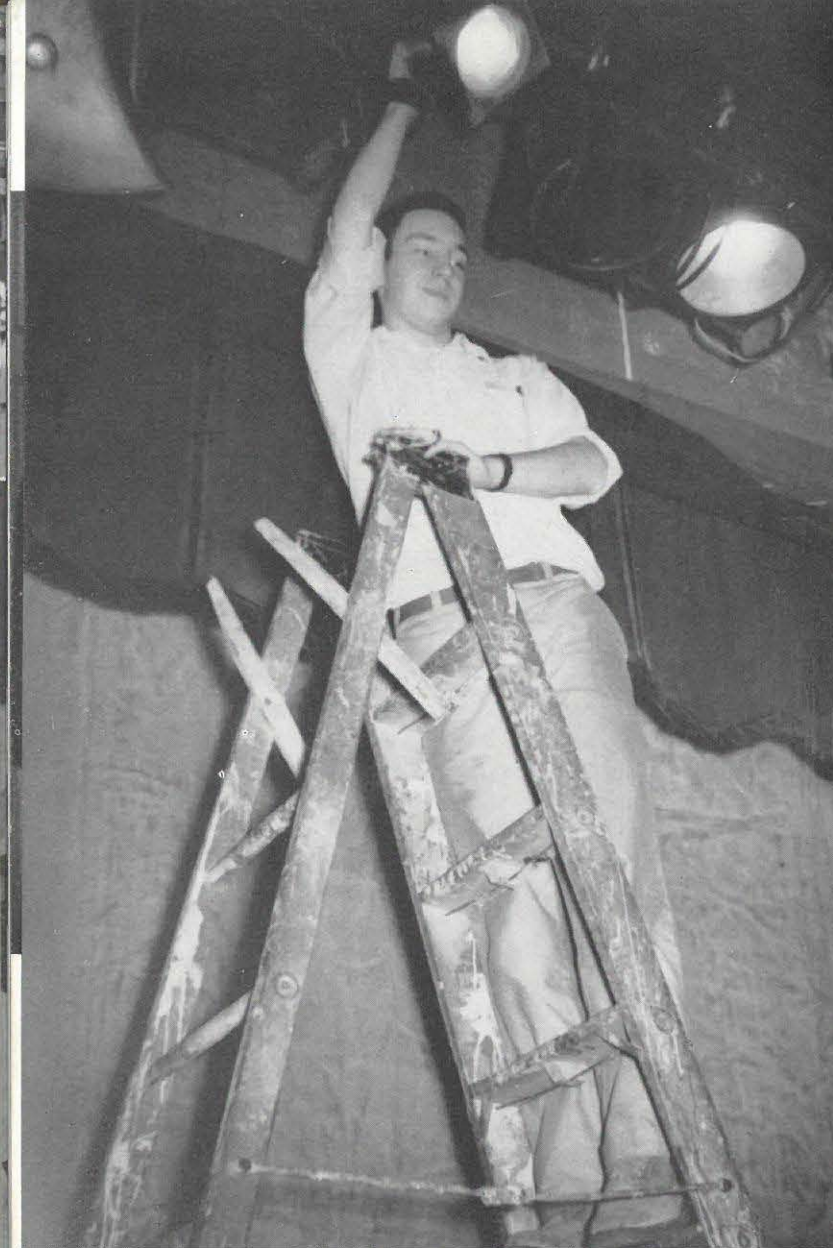

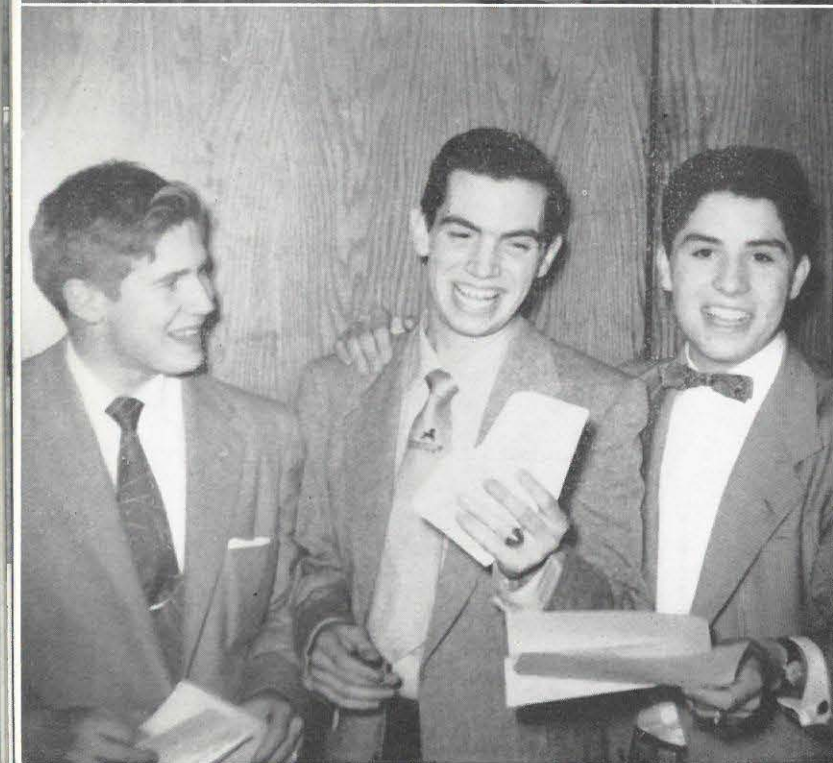

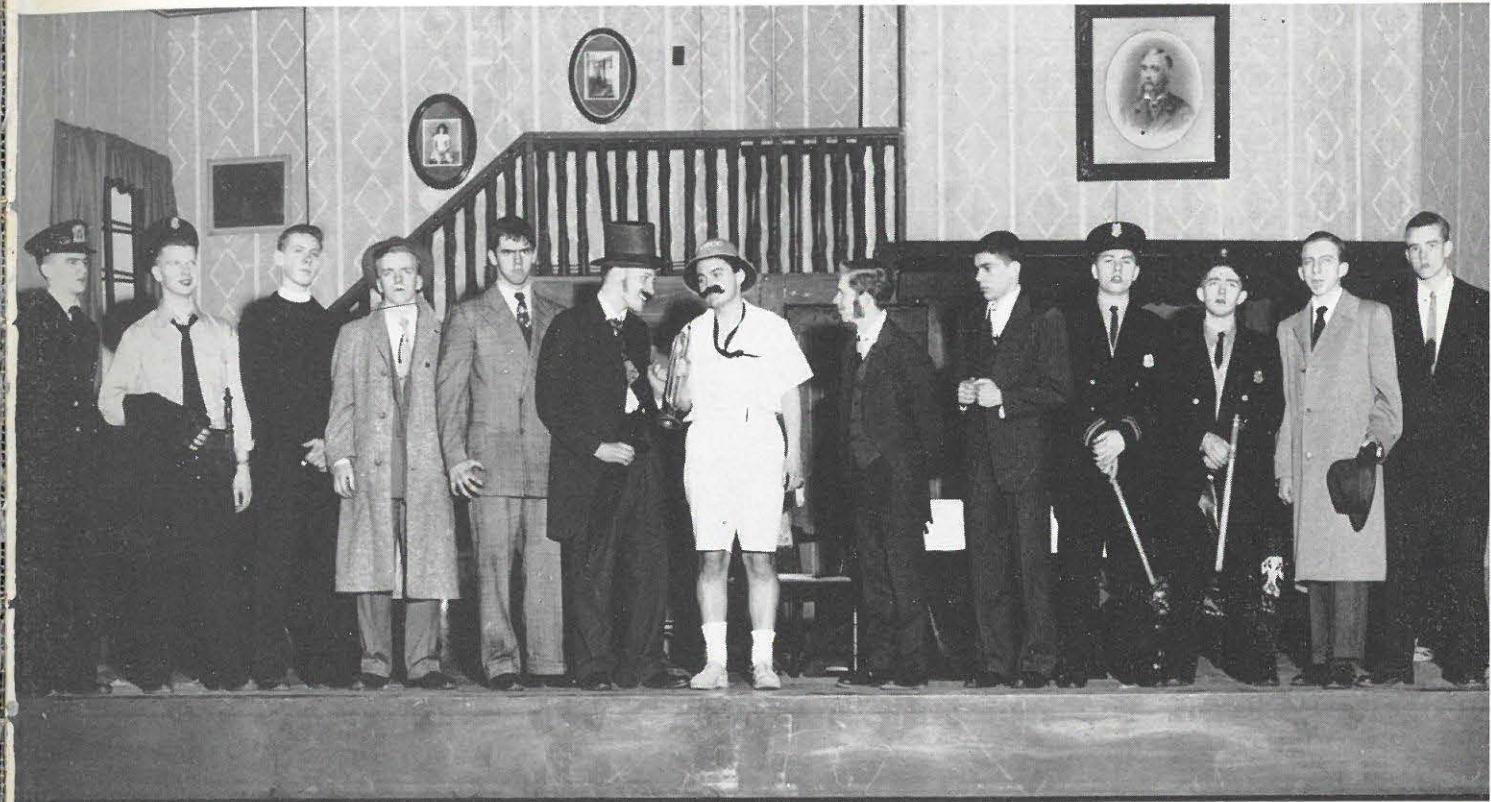
DRAMATIC CLUB

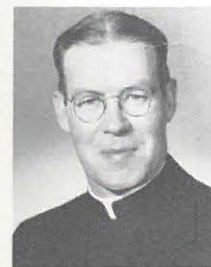

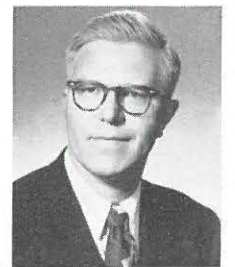

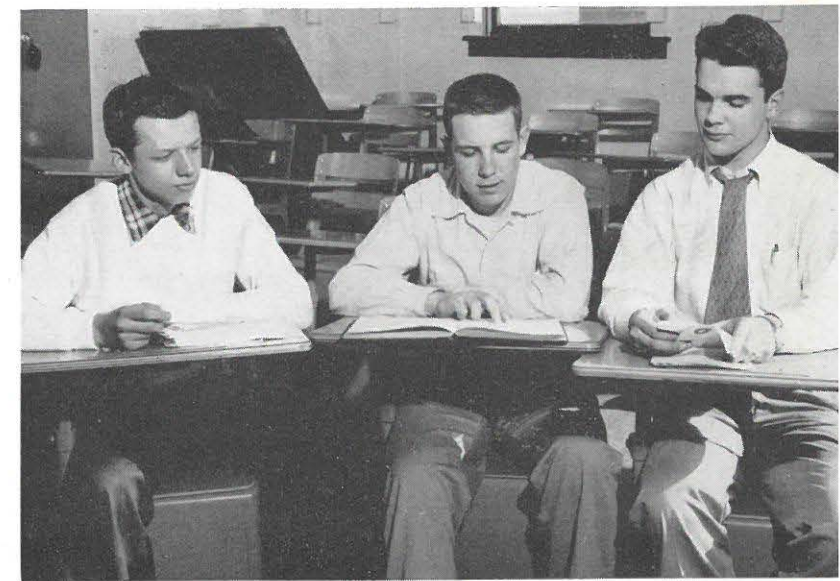

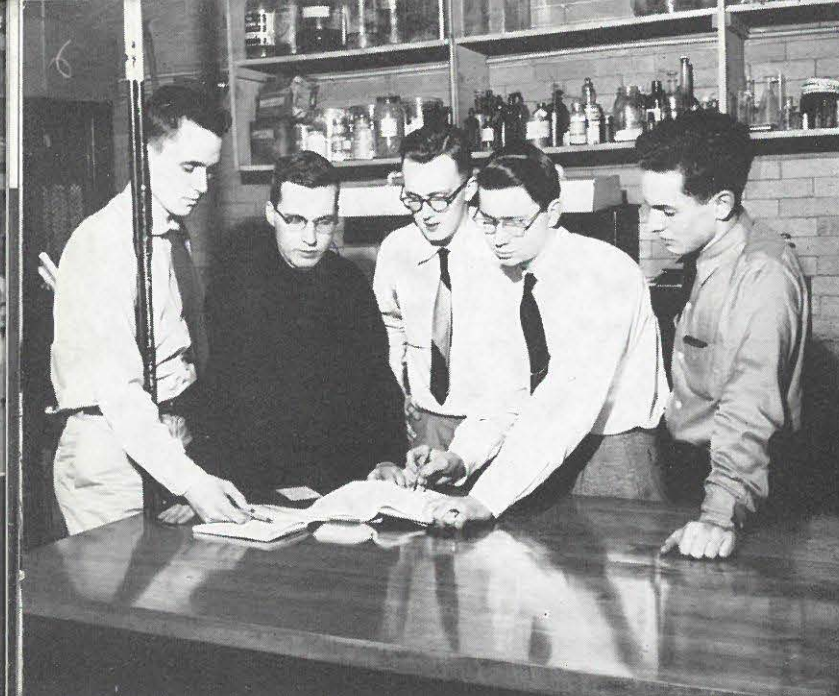

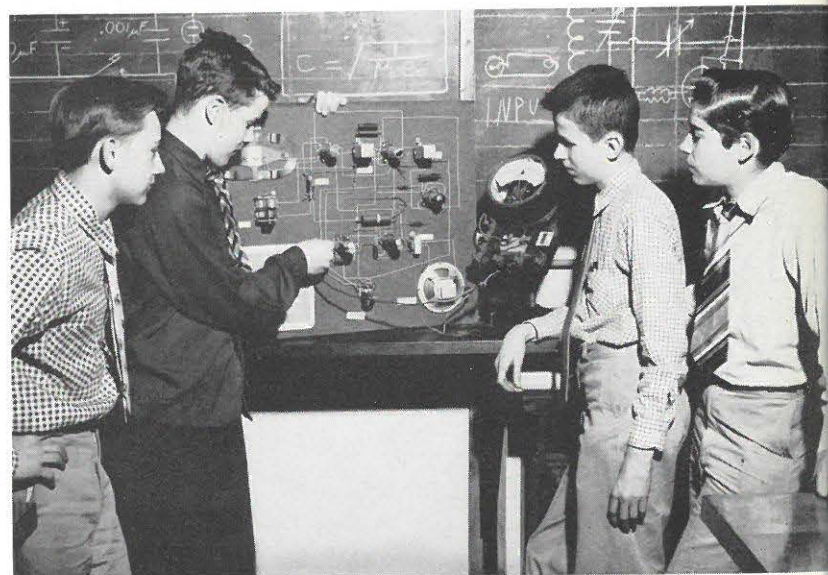

RADIO CLUB

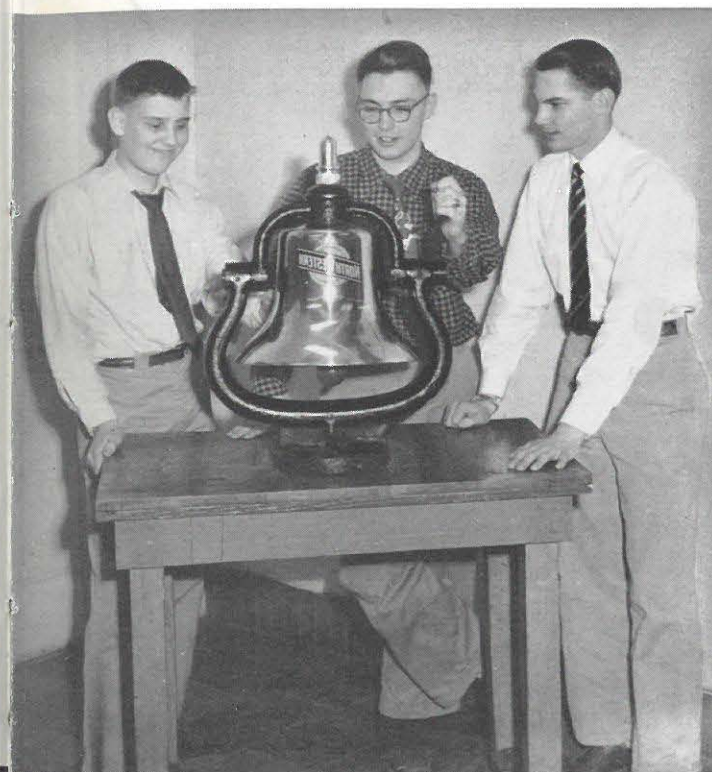

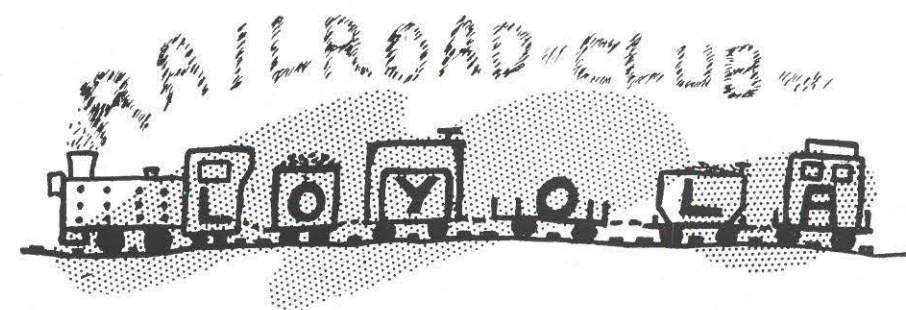

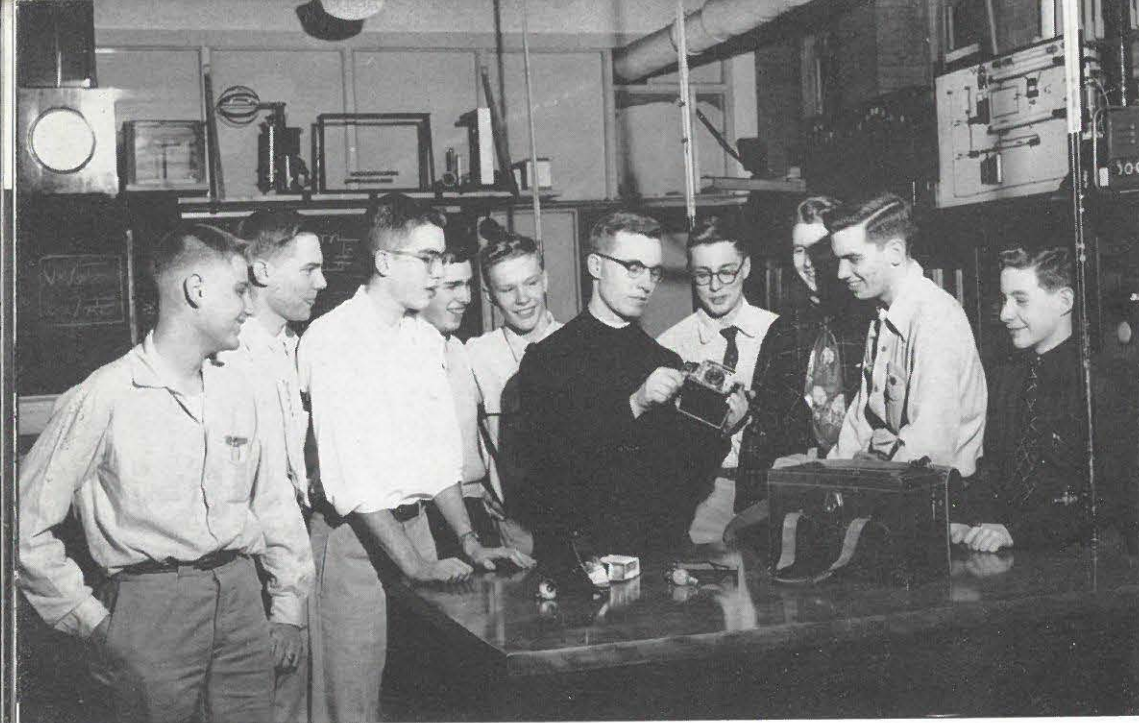
RAILROAD CLUB

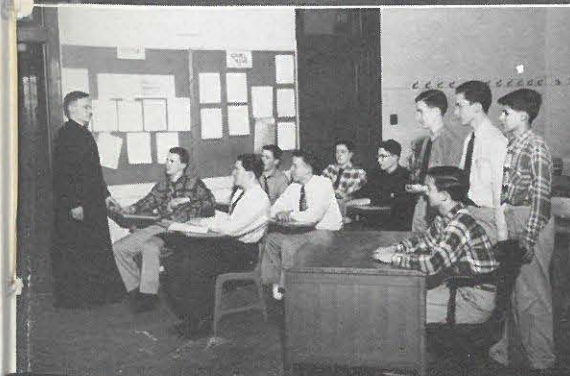

In terms of trophies won, this season was not so successful as last year, yet there are achievements to be recorded. Loyola ranked first in the Hammond, Indiana invitational practice tournament. At the Catholic Forum Speech Festival, Loyola, competing with twenty-one Catholic high schools, came in second in forensics. 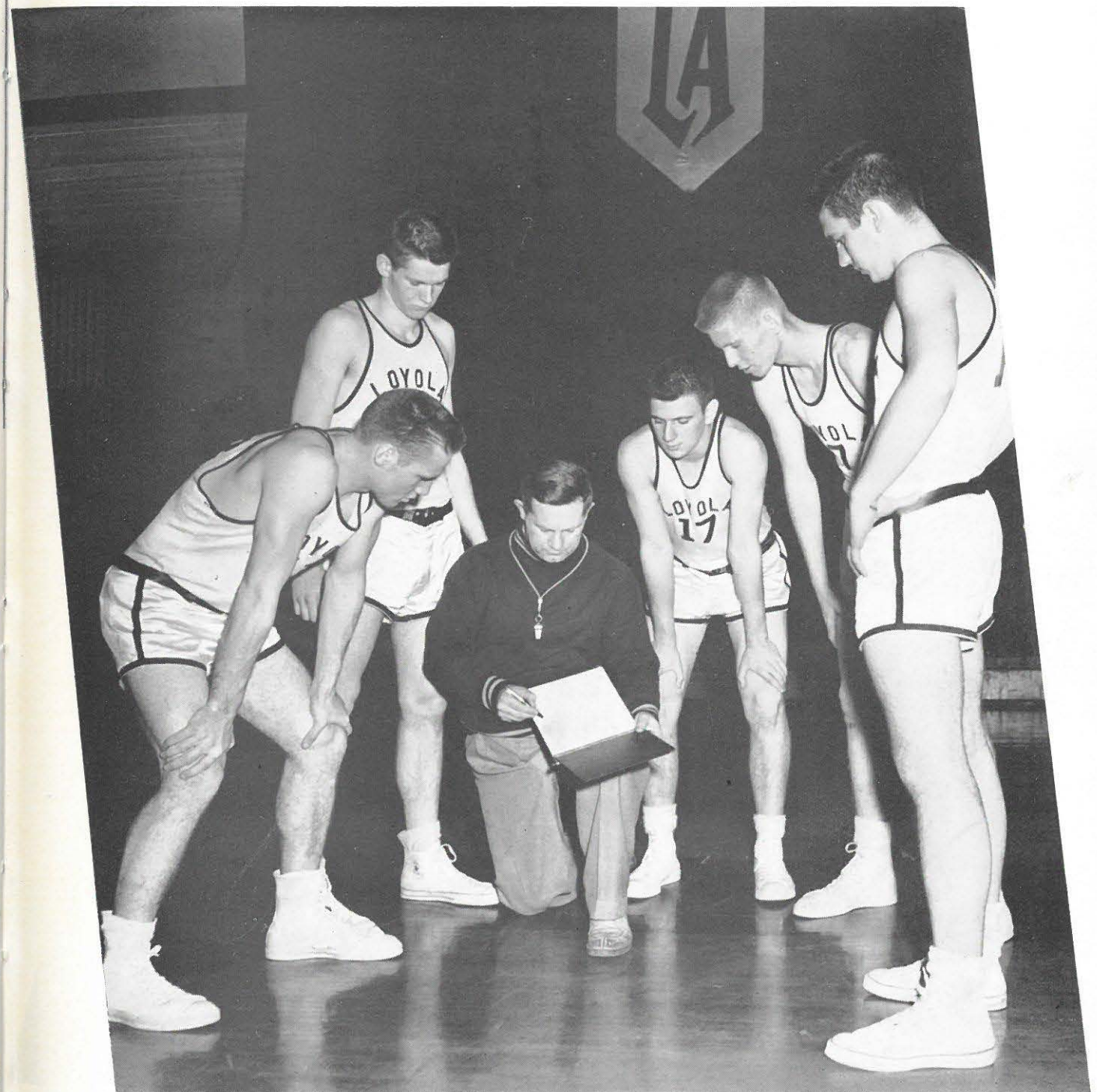


Jesuit educators allot to athletics a place in the educational program since sports develop such useful qualities as mental alertness, resourcefulness, cooperation, and physical strength.

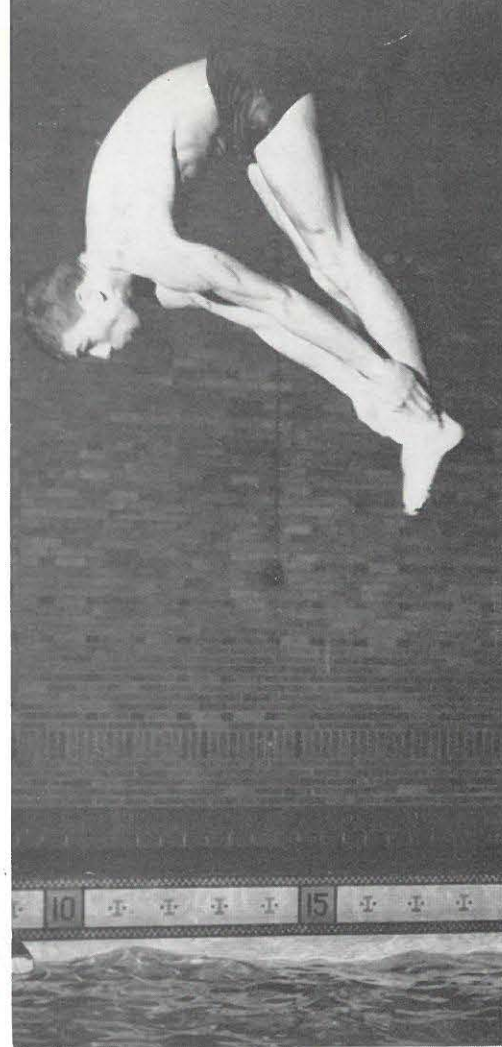

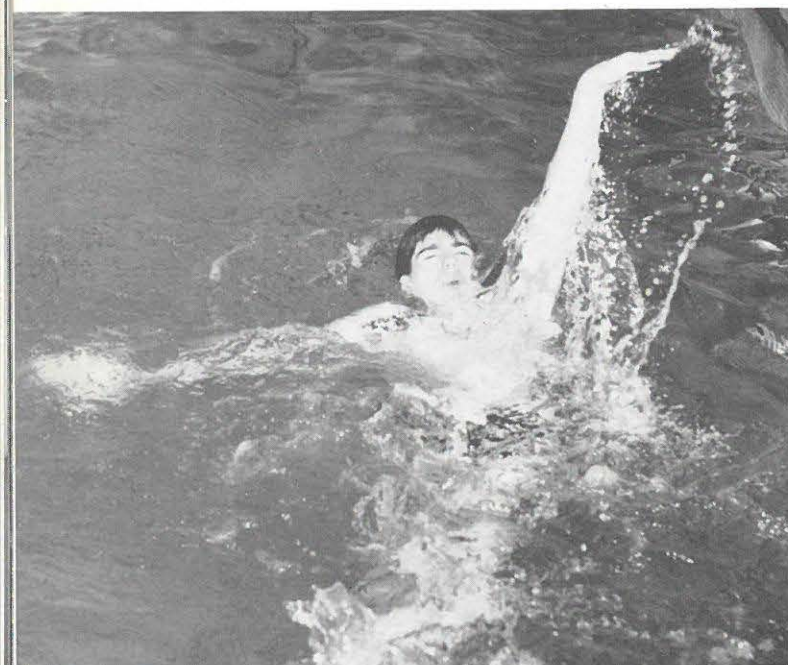
SWIMMING

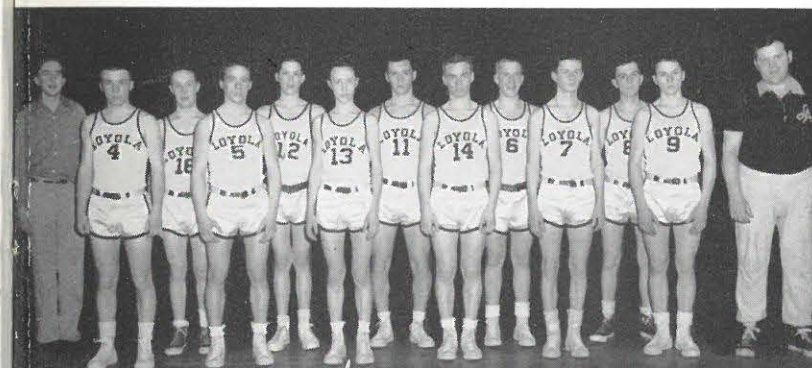
Champions of the St. George Tournament and of the South section—these were the impressive titles gained by one of the finest teams in Loyola basketball history.

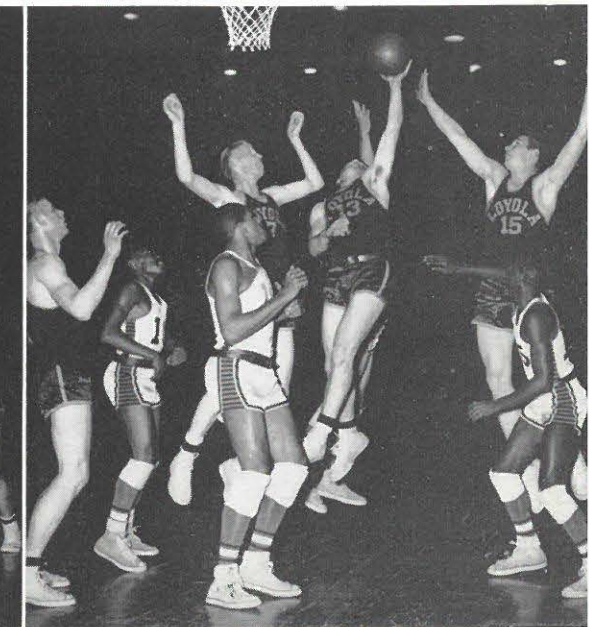
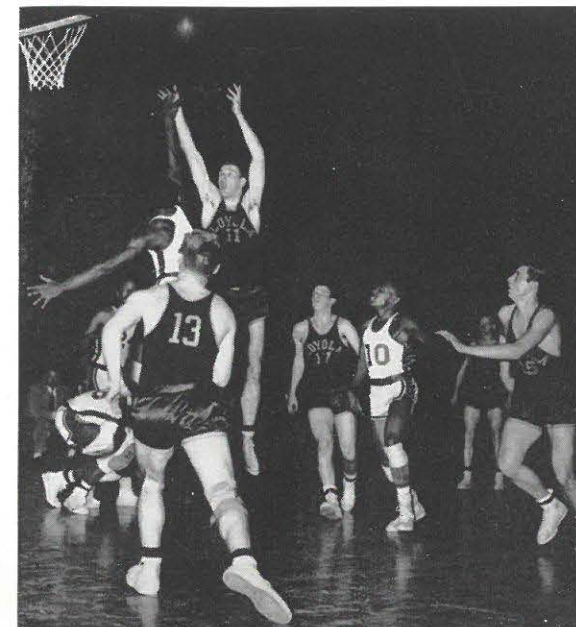
LOYOLA'S BASKETEERS PLAY AT STADIUM

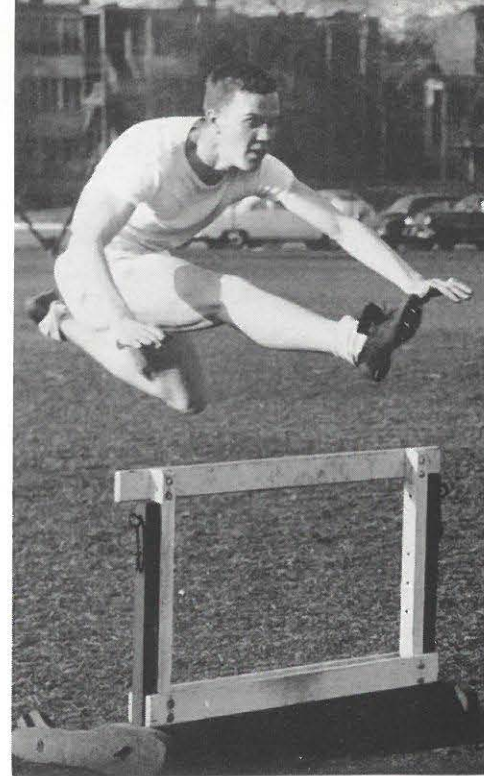

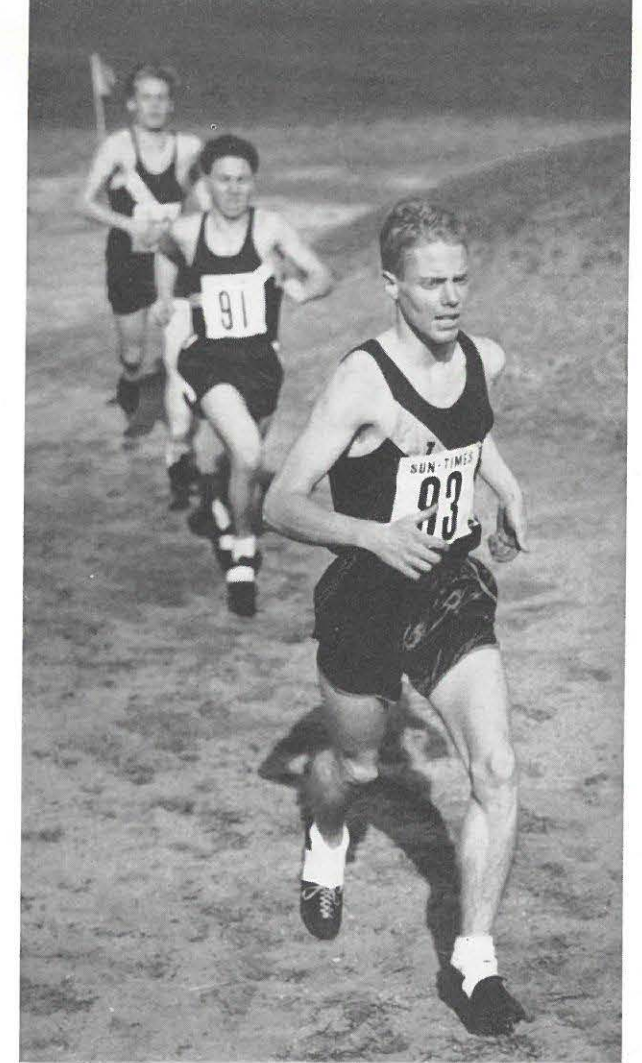

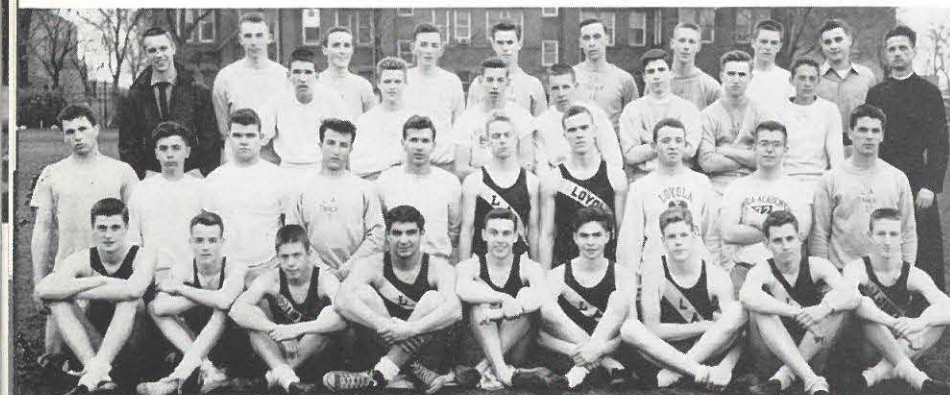
Dick Lahart, holder of the low-hurdle title in the Catholic league, demonstrates his form.
