
Dennis Gates arrives at the Erie with a big smile on his face. Either he enjoys very cold weather or he was just glad to be inside the warm restaurant.






Tom Porte, Vince Daley, Ray Hartman, Les Galo and John Rappel were still on their good behavior when this photo was taken.


