disease and cancer.



While in the Latin-English program at the Academy, he was a student athlete lettering in Tennis as a Junior. Thanks to Jim and his teammates, they won the Catholic League Championship in 1958. Jim took an active role in the Drama

Club for 2-years, took a run at singing with the Glee Club as a Sophomore, joined the Gavel Club in Freshman year and assisted in putting the Yearbook together as a Senior. He went on to attend the University of Notre Dame, having graduated in 1962. He then served as a
